

Climate Improvement Process

Readiness	Assessment and Analysis	Action Planning	Implementation	Reflection
Schools assess and reflect on the school's capacity, commitment and competence in carrying out comprehensive school climate improvement. This involves reflecting the school's leadership capacity, vision for school climate and relevant standards.	Schools administer a school climate survey to students, staff, parents and other stakeholder groups. They also conduct audits of their existing program and data sources in an effort to understand what is working and what needs improvement.	Schools begin by developing a short term-action plan to improve school readiness, engage the school community with climate data, and address immediate needs. Later, the team develops a long-term action plan which includes modifications to school programs, policies and practices to support positive school climate.	Actions plans are implemented for a period of time, during which data is collected to support later reflection.	The leadership team and school community reflect on the school's progress and the leader team's effectiveness. The school may return to earlier phases of work or modify the existing action plan to ensure continuous improvement.

DOMAINS IN THE SURVEY

Student Support

The Student Support scale measures how much students feel listened to, cared about, and helped by teachers and other adults in the school to realize behavioral and academic goals.

Social/Emotional Learning

The Peer Social and Emotional Learning scale measures students' perception of their peers' social and problem-solving skills.

School Safe and Respectful Climate

The Safe and Respectful Climate scale measures two things: how physically safe students feel and how emotionally safe students feel.

- → Deployment of high leverage activities that enhance school climate

How Is The Data Used?

Current School Structure: PBIS Teams at the Elementary School, Climate Committee at Secondary

Building Improvement Goals:

Secondary (HS, MS):

→ Develop and implement a system of supports for all students that addresses individual student needs and recognizes prosocial school-wide expectations.

Elementary:

- → PBIS (Positive Behavior Intervention and Support) full school implementation of consistent behavioral expectations, common lesson plans for all students for all school environments, reinforcement system, data tracking system for disciplinary actions (for building level action planning);
- → Implementation of revised MTSS process;
- → Implementation of Elementary SAP (Student Assistance Program)
